- Business Address (May also be residential address if operating at residential address)
- Decide Name of Company
- Business Registration Fee R 175
- Or
- Use Business Registration Company +/- R 900 (Com Name Reserv, COR14.3,IT Reg, Reg Fee, B-BBEE, Share Cert)

REGISTERING B-BBEE



- WHAT DO YOU NEED?
- Complete Sworn Affidavit form and have Commissioner of Oaths Sign and Stamp, for Exempted Micro Enterprise General Revenue below R 10m.
- Alternatively, independent service providers will assist if business is already in operation to assess your contribution and discuss your B-BBEE scorecard
- 5 Criteria (Equity Ownership 25%, Management Control 15% + bonus, Skills Development 20% + bonus, Enterprise Development 40% +bonus, Socio-Economic Development 5%)

- WHAT DO YOU NEED?
- Company Incorporation Certificate (COR14.3)
- Business Bank Account

- Follow instructions for IT, VAT, PAYE etc
- Voluntary VAT registration is possible otherwise Revenue over R 1m requires VAT Registration

- THINK THOROUGHLY ABOUT YOUR PRICING STRATEGY AND PRICE ACURATELY




